Arts Street works with multiple partners/clients throughout the year providing youth art and designs for fee for service. Along with signage and murals we have had some special requests! These have included wheat paste photographic murals, fiber arts, traditional arts and more. Youth are guided by an Arts Street artist/instructor during a creative industries academy or internship to complete these client projects.

Depending on the project, youth learn skills in graphic design, photography, Photoshop, Illustrator, Procreate as well as traditional art forms such as sewing. Working on these real-world projects, youth must follow client specifications and deadlines and give a final presentation of their work. Ultimately, youth are able to see their work produced and add these projects to their resume.



Steamboat has a retail shop on top of the mountain, where customers can visit and make their own t-shirt, choosing from different fun designs. Our young artists were directed to create designs that would represent Steamboat Resort and provide customers with a physical memory of their time at the resort. Interns brainstormed designs on paper and then turned them into digital designs. The final designs were presented by each intern to the client. A final design was chosen by Steamboat Ski & Resort, and it can be seen in the Torian Sports retail shop where customers may choose it for their souvenir t-shirt. All our interns submitted amazing work and the design chosen was by artist Lyell F., age 18.

In 2025, Arts Street was awarded an Equity in Arts grant in partnership with CHSC and Denver Parks & Recreation to complete a public art piece that highlighted the La Alma community and its identity through the eyes of young artists. Arts Street's CHSC students were led by instructors Juan Fuentes, Adama Bamba and Jessica Early to create four large-scale photographic wall murals for the La Alma Recreation Center. To complete these reflective pieces, students learned photographic skills and explored what it means to be a community. They took photo walks in the La Alma neighborhood and focused on visual storytelling, capturing the historic aspects of the area and what they felt celebrated the neighborhood. They then utilized the medium of wheat paste collage and paint to complete the large pieces. The finished art now hangs in the game room at the La Alma Recreation Center as a reflection of pride and joy for the entire community.






For this project, 18 Arts Street artists ages 15-19, met with our client, Denver Housing Authority's Columbine Homes development, and learned about the building of their community gardens and partnership with Denver's People's Budget which distributed funding for creating these gardens. Our client asked interns to create vibrant pavers and a sign design for the gardens. They received guidance on colors and imagery that our client wanted to see on the pavers including bright colors, pollinators, flowers and vegetables. Led by artist Devin Urioste our interns sketched out designs for approval by the client and painted their designs on large pavers. Our artists also created digital designs for signage that will be fabricated out of metal.

Each artist had at least one paver installed in the gardens and Kimora W.'s design was chosen for the signage. An opening celebration was held at the gardens with DHA staff and City Councilwoman Jamie Torres recognizing the work of Denver's People's Budget, DHA staff and Arts Street artists.

Art Street's youth art team met with our client, Steamboat Resort, and were asked to create three different sticker designs, either digitally or with traditional mediums. The client wanted designs that would appeal to families and visitors to the resort, that represented Steamboat and the mountain activities, and could also be a souvenir. The interns presented their final designs to the client, and each intern had at least one design chosen to be made into high-quality stickers. One standout intern, Kimora W., had all three of her designs chosen. Kimora was then chosen to assist in refining the designs and to be part of the production meetings with the client. Once the stickers were produced, they were shipped to Steamboat and Winter Park where they are for sale in Steamboat Store, Giggie Gulch, Steamboat Apparel and Gifts, and Sheraton in Steamboat and James & Parry's in Winter Park.

Arts Street's team worked with client Wood Partners, facilitated by NINEdotARTS, to develop artwork for a salon wall for their affordable housing project being built in Sun Valley. The project involved creating multiple art pieces by Arts Street's emerging artists that expressed the Denver community and showcased each individual artist's voice. Led by professional Denver artists, the young adult team worked in multiple mediums including collage, painting, and digital photography. All artwork was submitted to the NINEdotARTS and Wood Partners client team and they narrowed the images down to 30 pieces that were installed in the Alta Mile High building.

Our intern team learned animation to create a large public art installation of animations projected on the Denver Downtown Clocktower on the 16th Street Mall. Arts Street's client, Night Lights Denver, presented information on this project to the interns and encouraged them to produce a theme they thought the public would enjoy. Interns chose the theme of a happy memory that they each have. Examples of the theme included learning that they had been accepted into cosmetology school, a camping trip and playing games with family. Led by artist/instructor, Chelsea Romaniello, our young artists learned about asset creation using iPads and Procreate software, and how to create an animation using After Effects software. This project culminated with a celebration of interns, friends, family members and Arts Street staff downtown to see the premier of the animations being projected!



Arts Street was commissioned by Denver Housing Authority's Finance Department to solve an issue in their hallway of bare walls and acoustics that made for a very noisy work environment. We devised a solution of creating large-scale, vibrant textile art pieces and covering sound absorbing foam panels for the client. Our youth team met with the client to learn about specifications and preferences such as colors and themes. The client expressed that they would like nature scenes and colorful but calm color palettes. Led by Arts Street artist/instructor, Jessica Early, youth sketched designs for the panels and moved them to digital designs. These were submitted to the client who chose their top four designs created by Dani R., JoAnna A., Melissa V., and Lee M. The digital designs were enlarged to create paper patterns used for cutting the designs from material for the large 27"x 54" panels. Youth learned sewing techniques while "painting" with fabric to produce amazing results.

Arts Street worked with a team of 21 youth, ages 14-19, to gain knowledge in urban farming while creating artistic elements for Denver Housing Authority's Sun Valley's Grow Garden. Led by artist Jasmine Wynter, youth also worked on digital designs for large-scale fence wraps for the garden. Utilizing their knowledge about urban farming and to promote the garden to the Sun Valley community, youth first sketched ideas for designs inspired by patterns in nature they observed on field trips to green spaces. They then learned how to translate these designs to Adobe Illustrator for printing. Six of these designs were chosen by DHA, fabricated and attached to the fences of the garden to attract visitors, showcase the vegetables and flowers, and promote healthy food access.

Arts Street team worked with client City Councilman Hinds from Denver District 10 for a one of a kind project. Because the boundaries of Denver's city council districts changed, Councilman Hinds hosted several events in District 10 to get to know more people living there and let them know about resources in the District. Youth artists were tasked with creating mascots to represent District 10. Our client gave the youth ideas for characters like ghosts, hipsters, punks and cats. He also requested that artists consider using Councilman Hinds' service dog, Porthos, as one of the characters. Youth were asked for names and back stories on their creations and came up with some amazing characters! The mascot designs were used on flyers and publicity as well as passed out as stickers at events.







Arts Street's youth artist interns created another amazing installation creating art for University of Denver's Law School that represented social justice issues important to the Denver community. A team of youth, ages 14-18, started the process by researching an issue that was important to them, taking into consideration how it related to their own lives. Next, they worked digitally to create a symbol that not only represented the issue but expressed a solution and encouraged change. From there, they worked with Arts Street staff to turn their symbol into a flower that could be used as a stencil on a large textile banner. Finally, using hand painted dye techniques and a resist transfer process, they worked with Denver artist, Bree Angela, to create a "garden of justice" on their banners, combining the symbols and thinking about color and pattern.

Arts Street focused on a logo design project for client, Zayo Group. Youth were given themes and specifications to create logos for teams within the Zayo Group. Youth worked by hand sketching their logos and then designing them digitally in Adobe Illustrator. Finally, they presented their logos at Zayo Group's headquarters in downtown Denver. Youth received a tour of the facilities and were told about the various career paths at Zayo Group. Zayo Group chose 5 final logo images that were used to create badges for team members. This project was especially meaningful because the Zayo team member who reached out to us was a YEA graduate and former Arts Street participant, Jose Catarino.
